

CALL FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

HARMONISATION OF INDIVIDUAL QUANTITATIVE FOOD CONSUMPTION DATA

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The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) is working hand in hand with the World Health Organization (WHO) and other international partners to bring to light existing evidence and knowledge on what people eat.

Food consumption data, particularly Individual Quantitative Food Consumption Data (IQFCD) are collected in many countries, including Low and Middle-Income Countries (LMICs). However, they are largely underutilized, due to poor dissemination and lack of harmonization that prevents comparison across periods of time, seasons and geographical locations.

In response to this, FAO and WHO work jointly to improve the availability of IQFCD worldwide by collating existing datasets, harmonizing them and sharing through an online platform called <u>the FAO/WHO Global</u> <u>Individual Food consumption data Tool</u> (FAO/WHO GIFT).

This Call for Expression of Interest, issued by FAO, is to identify institutions from LMICs, which have access to IQFCD that could be eventually shared thought the FAO/WHO GIFT platform, and are interested in entering into a contractual agreement with FAO to harmonize these datasets as well as their supporting documentation according to FAO standards. Based on such agreement FAO would cover the costs of the harmonization work.

BACKGROUND

The Food and Nutrition Division (ESN) of the FAO, together with its partner institutions, created <u>the</u> <u>FAO/WHO Global Individual Food consumption data Tool</u> (FAO/WHO GIFT). FAO/WHO GIFT is a multipurpose global database of food consumption data which fills the gap in understanding what people are consuming around the world, promoting the use of these data to better inform evidence-based policies and guidelines on healthy diets.

The FAO/WHO GIFT platform disseminates harmonized dietary intake data from national and sub-national level surveys conducted all over the world through a FAO hosted web-platform that is publicly available and free of charge to access and use. This platform, intended for use by both experts and the broader audience, aims to facilitate access to age and sex disaggregated data on individual food consumption and to provide high quality food-based nutrition indicators that can trigger targeted policies to improve diet quality. The tool also provides data for the assessment of dietary exposure to potentially hazardous agents. Datasets suitable for insertion in the FAO/WHO GIFT platform undergo a process of harmonization. This process includes the mapping of the foods reported as consumed with the FoodEx2 classification system¹, and the formatting of the food consumption database in a specific way. In addition, FAO/WHO GIFT format requires that all recipes (i.e. mixed dishes with more than one ingredient) are disaggregated into single ingredients. Each ingredient should have the amount and nutrient content reported as consumed, which, in the majority of cases, refer to the amount and nutrient content as cooked.

The aim of this Call for Expression of Interest is to identify institutions from LMICs who own or have access to IQFCD and would be interested in sharing the data. Service contracts called Letter of Agreements (LoA) could be awarded by FAO to these institutions. The objective of the service contract between FAO and an institution would be to develop supporting tools related to data harmonization and standardization based on one or more datasets of individual quantitative food consumption dataset owned by the institution.

The supporting tools to be developed can include, but are not limited to: table of foods and recipes reported as consumed in the dataset mapped with the FoodEx2 classification system; recipe database with the disaggregation of all mixed dishes reported in the dataset, including the amount and nutrient values of each recipe ingredient; a list of all the food composition sources used to match the information on the recipe ingredients and the foods reported in the dataset to their nutrient values.

The development and provision of supporting tools based on individual quantitative food consumption datasets will facilitate the insertion of these datasets in the FAO/WHO GIFT platform.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

The Institution

The selected institutions will be universities, research institutes, Governmental institutes, NGOs, that fulfill all of the following criteria:

- 1. Are legally registered as a not-for-profit entity.
- 2. Operate and are registered in a low or middle-income country. Check the country here.
- **3.** Own an eligible dataset (see the requirements below) or have access to an eligible dataset owned by another institution.
- 4. Provide FAO with all the necessary information on the dataset in order to assess the scope and amount of work required for the development of supporting tools.
- **5.** Are able to perform data harmonization activities which include, but are not limited to, data coding with the FoodEx2 data classification and description system, recipe disaggregation, and documentation of food composition data used in the dataset.
- **6.** Are able to participate in online trainings and meetings with the FAO/WHO GIFT team to receive necessary guidance and technical support in data harmonization.
- **7.** Have sufficient human resources available to perform the work (it is not permitted to sub-contract or use funds to hire additional personnel to perform the work).
- **8.** Are equipped with the necessary IT infrastructure, skills and technical support needed to carry out the work.
- 9. Are able to communicate with the FAO/WHO GIFT team in English, French or Spanish.
- **10.** Agree to share their data publicly and sign a License to Redistribute Contribution to allow FAO to disseminate the data in the most disaggregated format through its dissemination platforms.

The Dataset

The eligible dataset needs to fulfill all of the following criteria:

- 1. Method of data collection: Individual quantitative 24h recalls or records/diary (no Food Frequency Questionnaires or Household surveys).
- **2.** Presence of compulsory variables in the dataset (these variables are specified in the attached Application Form).
- **3.** Survey sample should cover the general population i.e. there should be no evidence of selection bias such as medical conditions, people who eat in the same place, etc.
- **4.** Sample size \geq 100.
- 5. Capture of all foods and beverages consumed within 24 hours (the capture of drinking water and vitamin and mineral supplements is preferred but not compulsory).
- **6.** Food list includes \geq 50 food items.
- **7.** Year of assessment \geq 1980.

THE TASKS

Below is the list of tasks, which can be included in the agreement:

- Participation to the FoodEx2 data classification and description system training provided by FAO;
- Mapping of the foods reported as consumed in the dataset(s) to the FoodEx2 classification and description system;
- Development of a recipe database with the disaggregation of all mixed dishes reported in the dataset containing the amounts and food composition information for all recipe ingredients;
- Compiling documentation of the food composition information used and respective bibliographic sources for all foods (food items and recipe ingredients) reported as consumed in the dataset(s);
- Liaison with FAO during the data harmonization and recipe disaggregation processes and prepare data harmonization and analysis reports.

POSSIBLE OUTPUTS

- Food list mapped with FoodEx2 food classification and description system
- Recipe database formatted according to FAO/WHO GIFT template
- Food composition database formatted according to FAO/WHO GIFT template

If you are interested in this opportunity, please complete and sign the application form that follows. The ten top-ranked candidates will be offered to enter negotiations. The harmonized rates to be offered to institutions to cover the cost of the work depend on the activities and the size of the dataset, and would be decided by FAO. The LoA allocation of funds scheme is presented in Annex 1.
