## Background

Scientific research, Technology and Innovation (STI) play a key role in spurring the transformation of the agriculture sector, for food and nutrition security, resilience and livelihoods of millions of family farmers. The STI contribution to create jobs and economic opportunities for African citizens cannot be over emphasized. However, the capacity to harness the potential of Agri-food STI is yet to be realized on the African continent. Responsible for the limited realization of STI are several challenges including but not limited to weak institutional capacity; limited human capacity and weak uptake pathways.

The few Afri-food STI initiatives have remained isolated and disregarding institutional, organizational and enabling dimensions. Though the creation of national, regional and continental level agriculture, food and environment research organizations has been seen as a step towards enhancing agricultural development, their institutional capacity to innovate coupled with limited political support are still the major barriers to the realization of their mandates (Badiane and Collins, 2016; Roseboom and Flahherty, 2016). This was confirmed during the UN Food System Summit 2021 Consultations organized by various institutions including the Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building in Agriculture (RUFORUM). The Consultations recommended a review of capacity gaps and identification of mechanisms to develop/strengthen the capacities be conducted. Further it was recommended that effective synergies and integration of these organisations and leveraging economies of scope and scale be considered for achieving sustainable impact and innovating in a near future.























It is against this background that this convening is being organised in order to inform Research and Development Actors on the needs in terms of training, research, innovation and entrepreneurship for strengthening Agri-food Systems in the continent.

The overall objective of the dialogue is to establish an operational partnership on capacity development in Agri-food Systems Science, Research and Innovation at different scales on the continent.

Specifically, the dialogue aims to achieve the following objectives;

- 1. Discuss the current state of agri-food Systems Science, Technology and Innovation capacity in the African continent: Policies, institutions, organisations and individual capacities to deploy state of the art agri-food STI will be discussed;
- 2. Review existing partnerships, collaboration and coordination mechanisms for strengthening agri-food Systems STI in Africa and propose actions for positive impact on the agri-food Systems Sector;
- 3. Discuss the agri-food Systems STI financing mechanisms and provide an African perspective for sustainable financing of the Sector;
- 4. Propose a Common Framework and a road map to guide Capacity Development interventions for strengthening Agri- food Systems STI in the continent.
