Description	1. Background
of the Session	Africa and Europe share a profound and historically rooted connection characterized by diverse cultures, geographical proximity, and a commitment to a common future. Their commitment to a common future is grounded in mutual values such as respect for human rights, freedom, equality, solidarity, justice the rule of law, and democracy—principles enshrined in the foundational text of both the African Union (AU) and the European Union (EU). This partnershi has been strengthened through a series of Africa-EU Summits, including ke meetings in Cairo (2000), Lisbon (2007), Tripoli (2010), and Brussels (2014 Notably, the Lisbon Summit produced the "Joint Africa-EU Strategy and Action Plan" (JAES), which established priorities for collaboration, particularly i Science, Information Society, and Space.
	In 2014, the partnership's priorities were restructured during Senior Officials meetings (SOM), which identified Food and Nutrition Security and Sustainabl Agriculture (FNSSA) as a top focus within the science, technology, an innovation framework of the AU-EU High-Level Policy Dialogue (HLPD Furthermore, the AU-EU Senior Officials Meeting (SOM) adopted a ten-yea (2016–2026) roadmap in 2016 for establishing a Research and Innovation (R& partnership on FNSSA. The FNSSA roadmap was primarily shaped by the El strategy and the CAADP, outlining the common R&I priorities for the AU and the EU within the FNSSA domain.
	Since then, new technological advances have been made. Digitalization is agriculture in particular, is making significant strides, and various Africa countries are adopting digital tools to enhance agricultural productivity an resilience. Technologies such as mobile apps, Geographic Information System (GIS), drones, and digital finance platforms are increasingly being used to support farmers with weather information, market access, and precision farmine techniques. However, only 5% of African smallholder farmers are consistent benefiting from digitalization, according to recent research. The sector is weak leveraging these technologies to achieve the USD 1 trillion potential of the African agriculture sector by 2030.
	The Consortium Europe-Africa on Research and Innovation for Food System Transformation (CEA-FIRST) is a pioneering initiative aimed at operationalizin the AU-EU International Research Consortium (IRC) on FNSSA. Addressing th challenge of fragmented research and innovation efforts whilst taken ner scientific and technological successes on board. The CEA-FIRST project seek to enhance coordination, increase the impact of investments, and drive foo system transformation across Africa and Europe. It aims to strengthen AU-EL collaboration by establishing a robust governance structure and innovativ funding mechanisms within the IRC. Through a public knowledge platform, learning environment, and coordinated working groups, CEA-FIRST will ensur that research outputs are effectively used to inform policy implementation an promote sustainable agricultural practices.
	Engaging research and innovation to build digital and climate-resilient agrifoo systems involves fostering a robust research ecosystem that innovates on how digital tools can be better leveraged to strengthen a climate-resilient foo system. Key challenges of research on digital agriculture in Africa include a lac of digital research capacity, insufficient digital research infrastructure, limite investment in tailored solutions, weak inclusion of digitalization in researc programs, the need for context-specific technologies that address divers farming practices, and low digital literacy.

	Some of the key issues that research on digital agriculture may address, especially in Africa include: effective methods to improve digital literacy; how precision agriculture and early warning systems can better solve extreme weather issues; how to implement effective policies and frameworks for agricultural data; how to better leverage e-commerce platforms and mobile-based financial services to achieve the objectives of the Africa Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA); how digital agriculture innovations and youth entrepreneurship can be scaled to ensure long-term impact, sustainability and boost employment; and how solar energy and tele-irrigation can be better harnessed.
	Through the CEA-FIRST Coordination Support Action, funded under Horizon Europe, digital IRC Knowledge Management tools are being developed to enhance processes of policymaking and R and I implementation. The ultimate goal of CEA-FIRST is to create a functional, sustainable platform aligned with key EU and AU priorities, such as the European Green Deal, the post-Malabo Comprehensive African Agricultural Development Programme (CAADP) and the AfCFTA while addressing global challenges of climate change and food security.
	This session therefore aims at fostering a pointed dialogue among African and European policymakers to channel new thoughts on the on-going process of updating the 2016–2026 AU-EU FNSSA roadmap towards defining the content and priorities of the new 2027-2036 AU-EU FNSSA Roadmap.
