7TH AFRICAN DIASPORA AGROFOOD FORUM ADAF23 PROFILE ENABEL PEM PROJECTS

ENABEL is the development agency of the Belgian federal government, implementing Belgium's international development policy.

Under the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the agency carries out public service assignments in Belgium and abroad, provides customised expertise, including Belgian public expertise, promotes the involvement of all partners and pursues top-level partnerships. Enabel also enhances the impact of Belgium in international development by carrying out assignments for Belgian and international third-party commissioners.

Human mobility has been identified by Enabel as a global challenge among four others (peace & security, climate change, social and economic inequality, and urbanisation). If managed well, it is considered to be a catalyst for inclusive economic and social development, both for migrants and for communities and countries of residence, transit and origin. In this regard, Enabel assists its partner countries in their responses to labour market needs and shortages, ensuring training in local communities and facilitating regional and international mobility, including circular mobility schemes for small and medium entrepreneurs, who are looking for business opportunities in the European Union.

In both Senegal and Côte d'Ivoire, Enabel launched the PEM projects (Pilot Projects for Entrepreneurial Mobility), based on the Global Skills Partnership approach, to support partnerships between small and medium enterprises and business support players (creation and incubation, acceleration, internationalisation of businesses) in Belgium, Senegal and Côte d' Ivoire.

In 2 years of implementation, the PEM Wecco'(Senegal) has already supported dozens of Senegalese and Belgian entrepreneurs, facilitating the creation of sustainable partnerships and connecting the two ecosystems. Regarding Côte d'Ivoire, the PEM N'Zassa will soon launch its first matching activities.

Within this framework, the PEM projects support entrepreneurs of small and mediumsized businesses in Senegal and Côte d'Ivoire and facilitate the connection with Belgian enterprises, notably those from African diaspora communities, by arranging for them to meet during a business trip in Belgium.

This action is integrated and complementary to the missions of Belgian, Senegalese and Ivorian economic agencies, and other relevant players such as diaspora associations or chambers of commerce.

INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF MIGRATION O'REMIT PROJECT



The O-REMIT project aims to offer diasporas in Belgium cost-effective alternatives for remittances and opportunities for investing their savings.

The project is funded by the Belgian government and implemented by the International Organization for Migration (IOM – UN Agency for Migration) in Belgium and Luxembourg in partnership with Zidicircle, Entrepreneurs for Entrepreneurs (OVO) and the National Bank of Belgium.

Through data collection efforts, awareness raising campaigns, workshops and investment trainings, the project will contribute to SDG target 10.C to "by 2030, reduce to less than 3% the transaction costs of migrant remittances and eliminate remittance corridors with costs higher than 5%".
